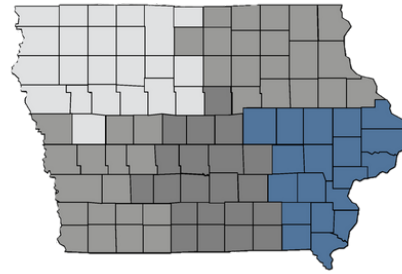


CCR&R OF SE IOWA

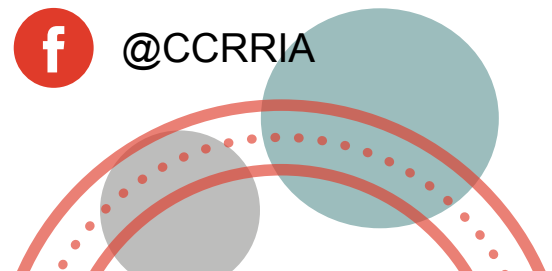
In Fiscal Year 2022, our top priorities included supporting programs that were re-opening or struggling to stay open while recruiting new programs.
